ACTIVITY 1

Upon arrival at Sandwe Village Sunrise Africa Relief/FFWPU officials were welcomed by a representative of chief Sandwe, Mr. Raphael Baluwa, who informed the group that the Chief had travelled to Chipata for a meeting. Rev. Banda proceeded to present the hammer mill and called on residents of Sandwe Village to take good care of it.

Mr. Baluwa thanked Sunrise Africa Relief/FFWPU for honoring their promise and delivering the hammer mill within the stated time frame. He mentioned that arrangements had already been made to ensure that the hammer mill was properly taken care of.





Rev Banda later presented the hammer mill manual to Mr. Baluwa and implored him to ensure that it was properly installed.

The team later posed for photos with Mr. Baluwa and other members of the Sandwe Village community.

ACTIVITY 2

The Sunrise Africa Relief/FFWPU officials arrived at Makale Clinic around 18 hours. After exchanges of greetings and introductions Mrs. Mwale presented the K20,000 cash on behalf of Sunrise Africa Relief.

Mrs. Mwale pointed out that Sunrise Africa Relief was happy to support the welfare of mothers and donating towards the construction of a mother's shelter at the facility.





The medical officer at the health facility Mrs. Sichinga expressed gratitude to Sunrise Africa Relief and FFWPU for the support stating that the mother's shelter would ensure that women have a decent and safe place to be while waiting to receive medical attention at the facility.



The project Coordinator for Makale Clinic Benson, Echoed Ms. Sichinga's sentiments and indicated that residents of Makale were ready to start the building for the mother's shelter almost immediately. The meeting at Makale Clinic successfully ended with a photo session.
